*7. Portents– the player can take the portents before the battle. This allows the General to re-roll 1 failed command roll once during the battle. Take the command test again – if successful the order is issued and the general can continue giving further orders if you wish.

Macedonian Phalanx: The regular Macedonian phalanx, inherited from the main army. Well drilled soldiers.

Egyptian Phalanx: Although equipped as their Macedonian counterpart, the Egyptian Phalangites lacked their level of training, reducing their ability to withstand prolonged fight.

Agema: A small part of the phalanx, regrouping veterans soldiers.

Cretans: The ubiquitous bowmen, always integrated as part of Macedonian-like armies to give a little bit of long range support.

Peltasts: This light infantry included greek or thracian peltasts, or even cretan or pisidians peltasts, as well as other garrisons units of lesser efficiency.

Galatians: Celtic people from the Danube area, the Galatians were fierce warriors.

Thureophores: Although equipped lightly with javelins and shield, Thureophores were trained to fight as

Skirmishers: As can be found in many armies, those skirmishers are armed with javelins, bows and slings.

Mostly Egyptian and Syrian archers or slingers.

Legionaries: May either represent imitation legionaries or legionaries remaining from Marcus Antonius' army.

Heavy Cavalry: The Cleruch cavalry, equipped and trained as companions.

Ethnic Cavalry: Local cavalry trained to fight with javelin.

Elephants: Although located in Africa, the Ptolemaics used some Asian elephants.
